**09/20/21 | QUEENS, NEW YORK** - CreArtBox is coming back to the NYC live music scene with the world premiere of the piece" Queens Preludes", a composition of 12 preludes for flute and piano written by Guillermo Laporta exploring the concept of "looking back at memories before life-changing events".

CreArtBox works with world-class artists to foster art commitment in today's society, supporting the creation of new music and live arts to enhance local communities and inspire future generations.

This production will featured artist Guillermo Laporta (flute and composer), Josefina Urraca, (piano) and Mizuko Kaji (set designer)

The concert will be held at the Plaxall Gallery located at 5-25 46th Ave, Queens, NY 11101 on October 6, 2021 (7.00pm)

In this production the stage design of the concert will be created by the Japanese designer and architect Mizuko Kaji. This design was created for the CreArtBox tour in Japan back in 2019.

The semi-transparent screens are interconnected on stage, in order to achieve a spatial sensation where sound, images and lights merge into a single universe.

The audience is divided into 3 groups using a 360 degree design with the audience facing in 3 directions. The audience feels the music and the image mixed through transparent projections, finding various relationships and depth with the musicians and the images.

The music reflect flashes of wondering about the past, rendering into music senses of trust, vertigo, uncertainty, assurance, ambiguity, and remembrance. Generally, a prelude is considered to be an introductory performance, action, or event preceding and preparing for the principal or a more important matter. Life can feel like an endless prelude. But sometimes, it's only noticeable when something significant happens.

This piece has been awarded with the City Artist Corp grant and also by the Queens Council on the Arts with public funds from the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs in partnership with the City Council.

The concert will be free. Seat reservation is required at <u>creartbox.nyc</u>

Flutist, composer, designer, multimedia creator, and entrepreneur based in New York City. Laporta's artistic work presents multidisciplinary connections between music, theater, dance and video. He is currently Artistic Director of CreArtBox and Artist in Residence at CultureLab. Queens. New York.

His main works as composer and playwright are: the ballet / opera Two Roads (2020), the visual concert Awave (2018), the play/concert Visuality (2012/14), the opera Noctum (2011), the musical London The show (2009), and CreArt Project I (2006)

His works have been presented in theaters and festivals in the United States, Spain and Japan with critics such as "an explosion of rhythm, color and sensitivity" (El Diario del Alto Aragón) and "an impressive staging" (EL PAIS) "a totally authentic visual and listening experience"," a unique take of classical music "(Times Ledger) or" a full scale set design and a unique visual approac "(I Care if You Listen)

Guillermo Laporta studied the Postgraduate in Advance Performance as well as the Undergraduate at the Royal College of Music in London with Jaime Martín, Paul Edmon Davies, Sue Thomas as well as the Superior Degree in Musikene (Spain) with Miguel Ángel Angulo.

He was co-principal flute of the Oviedo Filarmonia Orchestra from 2009 to 2012 and throughout his career as a flutist he has performed a wide repertoire of symphonic, opera and chamber works, with the BBC Concert Orchestra, Orquesta del Principado de Aturias, Le Train Bleu Ensemble, New York International Orchestra, Orquesta Sinfónica de Euskadi, sharing the stage with renowned musicians such as Sir. Roger Norrington, Andrew Litton, Pablo González, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Truls Mørk, Natalia Gutman, The Labèque sisters, Ainhoa Arteta, Jiri Barta or Heinrich Schiff, in prestigious venues around the world including Carnegie Hall or Lincoln Center.
